The leather industry diverts approx. 285 million hides of by-product waste annually from landfills, recycling hides into a durable, functional, timeless product.

Our tannery partners are required to be REACH Compliant and are in full compliance with water treatment regulations. Additionally, many of our tanneries are part of the Leather Working Group, an organization that is focused on improving sustainable practices within the leather industry.

We choose to work with tanneries that are excellent stewards of the environment and their communities and are often leading the way toward new and innovative chemistry and processes to further evolve the tanning industry.





The World's Most Sustainable Leather

One of the latest advancements for leather is the Wet-green method called Olive tanning—A completely organic, water-based tanning agent created from the by-product of fallen leaves from olive trees. This groundbreaking tanning method is the most sustainable method available in the industry today and has received the Cradle to Cradle Gold award.

Moreover, our Olive tanned articles are the first in the world to receive the red list free Declare label and qualify for LEED points on sustainable projects worldwide.
